State of Art Infrastructure

Foreign Students' Registry Office

Proctor Office

Airports

- Yellow line connecting Vishwavidyalaya metro station (University of Delhi)

Buses

MARKETS NEAR BY



- Kamla Nagar Market: Famous for popular fashion brands, Hudson Lane and Majnu ka Tila(North Campus)
- Sarojini Nagar: Lajpat Nagar, Ambience & Select City Malls, Khan Market etc are prominent shopping and eating destinations of South Delhi
- Chandni Chowk and Connaught Place are well connected to the North Campus area via the metro, while South Extension and Dilli Haat are easily accessible from the South Campus side.

ESSENTIAL SERVICES

• ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANCE



Foreign students having Indian visa with validity period of more than 180 days need to register at the Foreign Regional Registration Office, which is an online process. The necessary documentation support is provided.

• HEALTH ASSISTANCE



The W.U.S Health Centre in the North Campus of the University of Delhi provides 24/7 primary healthcare, except on Gazetted Holidays and Sundays, when it operates from 10:30 am to 8:00 pm.

BANKING SUPPORT



Convenient banking services are available on campus at State Bank of India and ICICI Bank branches (North Campus) and an SBI branch (south campus). Opening a savings account is straightforward with required forms, three passport-size photos, and signatures from existing account holders.


