The program

The UC | Chile Spanish program has over 30 years of experience teaching Spanish as a foreign language, which seeks to teach this language, both in the Chilean and Latin American ways.

Created in 1990, it is the first program for teaching Spanish as a second language in Chile and one of the first in Latin America, where more than 4,000 people have learned Spanish in its courses.
